Important Financial Deadlines for all PTA Units

To comply with federal and state nonprofit obligations, the following deadlines on or before for financial requirements:

November 1: Required membership dues deadline [This is new this year! Before, it was on December 1.] November 1: Audit Report deadline. Upload in MemberHub in compliance section. November 15: File 990 form with the Internal Revenue

Service (IRS). Avoid IRS revocation—file the 990! November 20: Confirmation receipt of 990 filing sent to Tennessee PTA. Upload in MemberHub.

Did you know that the Tennessee legislature introduced hundreds of potential pieces of legislation during the last session that affect education and children?

Topics ranged from funding, mandatory gun safety classes, gender and sports, sex education, and so much more. Community voice is critical in shaping the policy that affects our children and no matter what side of an issue you may fall on, we want all parents and community members to be informed. You can't advocate if you aren't informed. The Tennessee PTA has a great, easy way to be informed, and take action if needed, called <u>VoterVoice</u>.

VoterVoice is a program that allows you to sign up for simple alerts from us if there is something that the Tennessee PTA wants to make sure you know about. If it is something that parents and caretakers need to take action on, it sets up a simple way for you to quickly and easily contact elected officials as well. We hope all community members will sign up for VoterVoice and be a part of advocating for all children.

Position Statement on Local School Authority

Adopted by the Board of Directors on 10/10/2021

Tennessee PTA believes that local school districts are best suited to make real-time decisions about the health and safety of their students and should be fully equipped with all necessary authority and tools to be able to operate schools safely. While we recognize that there is no single solution that serves all districts, each school district must be able to meet the safety needs of their own district. The pandemic numbers in schools are forcing school systems to shut down with no learning available, or limited authority to make decisions that will keep children safely in schools. We believe it is time for the state Board of Education and the Governor's office to return decision-making authority to our local school systems, so that they can effectively operate their schools in accordance with the specific needs of their district.
