	WHEREAS,	Due to the fiscal crisis facing our state, Tennessee's schools could face losing millions in state revenue; therefore further reducing education funding for a state already ranked 49 th out of the 50 states; be it therefore
	RESOLVED,	That the Tennessee PTA and its constituent bodies urge the Tennessee Legislature to make education funding the first priority in budget matters and to seek long-term, permanent funding solutions for education; and be it further
	RESOLVED,	That the Tennessee PTA and its constituent bodies urge the Tennessee Legislature to make NO cuts to current education funding; and be it further
	RESOLVED,	That the Tennessee PTA and its constituent bodies encourage legislators to fully fund the Basic Education Plan (BEP); and be it further
	RESOLVED,	That the Tennessee PTA and its constituent bodies encourage the Tennessee Legislature to fully fund all legislated education mandates; and be it further
